The phrase "barefoot luxury" might sound like an oxymoron, unless you spend a week aboard **Blaston V** seeing the most beautiful islands of the Caribbean. The 190-foot **Benetti**, launched in 2014, is a study in simple elegance, from the climate-controlled winter garden on the skybridge with full glass panels that can be opened to the elements or closed for formal dining, to the interior by Green and Mingarelli that combines walnut, onyx, Lalique crystal, parchment, and silks in a refined way. Full-height windows in the saloon provide stunning views of the surrounding waters, while the master suite with study is one of the largest in its class. **Blaston V** also has an unusually sizable, full-beam VIP suite, and four other large staterooms to accommodate 12 guests. The yacht has a gym, cinema room, wine cellar, and humidor. The exterior is designed for outdoor living, with a sundeck that boasts a large Jacuzzi, bar, lounges, and sunpads. The water toys include scuba, water slide, flyboard, and a Jetovator—in other words, the latest and greatest toys for every age. **Blaston has a crew of 13. (camperandnicholsons.com)

Lamima

At 214 feet long, Lamima is on the larger end of wooden sailing yachts. The Indonesian phinisi ketch design may look like it first set sail a century ago, but Lamima was launched in 2012, with the most modern superyacht features. Noted yacht designer Marcelo Penna, who conceived Lamima, wanted to combine the best of old-world sailing with contemporary yacht design, with no compromise on comfort. The fusion includes a bright interior with a voluminous saloon and seven large guest staterooms. Asian influences in the furniture, fittings, and artwork are apparent. Like the unusual style, Lamima's cruising grounds in Indonesia are some of the most unspoiled in the world. Guests can kayak secluded coves in the Raja Ampat archipelago, sit on virgin beaches, chase dragons (or be chased by) in the Komodo archipelago, and snorkel or scuba (the yacht is a certified PADI training center) in the most pristine waters in the region. The boat is also perfect for alfresco dining and often features fresh vegetables or fish from local waters, while the onboard therapist can extract modern-day stress through massage and other spa treatments. The 20-person crew includes a tour guide, who has worked with National Geographic, to provide access to Indonesia's most remote areas. (camperandnicholsons.com)

Legend







Looking for the adventure of a lifetime? Legend will certainly get you there and back again. The enormous 254foot expedition yacht from Icon Yachts has a 7,000-mile range and completed an equally mammoth refit last
summer. The result: It is now officially the toughest charter vessel on the water, but with luxuries that make
daytime adventurers look forward to their evening comforts. With a Class 1 ice-breaking hull and equipment like
snowmobiles onboard, Legend was designed to navigate the extreme waters of the Arctic and Antarctic—in
extreme comfort. Icon Yachts, which did the four-year refit project in Holland, built in a full gym, Balinese spa with
sauna, a movie theater, and an enormous Jacuzzi. The Dutch yard also lengthened the swim platform by 14 feet
and added a swimming pool. In addition, Legend has a full commercial helipad, not just the touch-n-go on most
other yachts, as well as a three-person submarine. The yacht will be heading to Antarctica for the winter season,
along with up to 26 very fortunate guests in 13 staterooms. Beyond its normal 19-person crew, Legend can carry 10
expedition crew (doctor, ice-pilot, expedition leaders, and naturalists; among others). The expedition yacht's very
long range means it can cross the Atlantic and come back again on a single load of fuel.
